Supervisor Bronson commends Town of Marana on 30 year anniversary

Tucson, Ariz. – Pima County Supervisor Sharon Bronson attended Marana’s State of the Town luncheon today, celebrating Marana’s 30 years of incorporation.

“The Town of Marana is a model for smart growth,” said Bronson. “Marana has managed to strike a delicate balance, enacting progressive environmental protections without stifling economic development and progress. I commend the town on looking toward the future without losing sight of their rich heritage.”

Mayor Honea’s speech touched on many of the issues that have been hallmarks of Bronson’s time with the Pima County Board of Supervisors, including water, employment and economic development, community safety, and the efficiency of government services.

The luncheon was held at the Lazy K Bar Guest Ranch in Marana. Also in attendance from Pima County were Supervisor Ann Day, County Administrator Chuck Huckleberry, and several staff members.

Supervisor Bronson was elected to the Pima County Board of Supervisors in 1996. She represents District 3, the largest of the five supervisorial districts and the only district sharing more than 100 miles of international border with Mexico. Bronson served as Chair of the Board until 2006, and is currently co-chair of TREO, Tucson Region Economic Opportunities, Inc.
